Honourable Prime Minister,

Greetings from Pakistan Teachers Federation.

Today ie 8th March, we are in Pakistan celebrating International Women's day with the international community.

This day aims to focus global attention on the state of women when it comes to gender equality, bias, stereotypes and discrimination.

Women constitute about half of the total population of the country. But in Pakistan, most women's work takes place in non-market activities in the home or the informal sector. The gender gap report from the World Economic Forum ranked Pakistan 151 out of 153 countries.

80% of the educated women are enabled to join services or businesses due to their socially imposed responsibility of child care. The same is the position of lady educators, medical doctors and engineers.

The provisions of Day-Care Centres are not available in the Government Rules and Labour Laws.

This federation earnestly requests your honour to issue a directive for an opening day-care centre in every school, college and educational institution for

teaching and administrative staff by inserting provision of Day-Care centre in law.
